



## ARRL Friendship Award Rules and Application

The purpose of this award is to encourage friendly contact between radio amateurs (hams) and thereby discover new friends through personal communication with others.

1. The ARRL Friendship Award is available to any ARRL member who submits log extracts that show two-way communications with 26 stations whose callsigns end with each of the 26 letters of the alphabet. (For example: W4RA, KØORB, W3ABC...K1ZZ.) QSL cards are not required.
2. Log extracts should indicate: the current date, callsign, name, location, and another fact about the person contacted. (Other facts could include: age, other interests, family members who are also hams, occupation, school(s) attended, etc.)
3. Contacts may be made on any authorized amateur-radio frequency using any authorized mode. Contacts made through repeaters or satellites are both permitted and welcomed.
4. Contacts made be made from (or to) any location, or any number of locations.
5. Special endorsements (band, mode, etc.) are not available for this award.
6. Contacts must be made November 1, 1993 or after.
7. Application Procedure:
  - A. Complete this application and submit it to any participating ARRL-affiliated club or to ARRL HQ.
  - B. Applications sent to ARRL HQ must include a fee of \$10.00.
